#### **Day 1 - Alexandria to Cairo**

When you disembark from the ship in Alexandria, you will be met and set off on the three-hour drive to Cairo.

Once you arrive in Cairo, you can immerse yourself in over 5,000 years of Egyptian history by visiting the Grand Egyptian Museum (GEM), which is the world's largest archaeological museum. This architectural marvel houses over 100,000 artefacts, including the complete burial collection of King Tutankhamun. Marvel at colossal statues and intricate carvings and explore exhibits that celebrate Egypt's rich heritage in a sustainable and respectful manner. The GEM promises an extraordinary, immersive journey through the ages.

Spend the night at the five-star Mena House Giza hotel in Cairo.

Upon arrival, you can check in, freshen up, and enjoy a delightful dinner at the hotel before settling in for the night and preparing for another incredible day of exploration the following day.

#### **Day 2 - Cairo to Port Said.**

After a buffet early breakfast at the hotel, you will check out and depart for the visit of the Pyramids of Giza, which are considered the most famous of Egypt's attractions and the only monuments left of the ancient wonders.

The three main Pyramids at Giza were built as tombs by Cheops, his son Chephren, and Chephren's son Mykiernus to preserve each of the pharaohs' mummified bodies for eternity.

For centuries, these unique structures have intrigued the world while surviving the rise and fall of great dynasties. Southeast of the great Pyramid stands the Sphinx carved out of solid rock around 2650 BC.

Following the Pyramids visit, there will be a quick shopping stop and will continue the tour to Sakkara. The Step Pyramid of Sakkara, that overlooks Zoser's mortuary complex. Dating from 2700 BC, the Step Pyramid is the oldest stone structure in the world and was designed by Imhotep for King Djoser. In addition to Djoser's Step Pyramid, there are another 16 pyramids on the site in various states of preservation or decay.

Sakkara is also home to an impressive number of mastaba tombs. Because the necropolis was lost beneath the sands for much of the past two millennia, many of the mastaba tombs have been superbly preserved, with both their structures and lavish internal decorations intact.

Lunch will be served at one of the deluxe restaurants.

After lunch, visit the Citadel and Mohamed Ali Mosque. It is also referred to as the Alabaster Mosque due to the extensive use of that stone on some of the exterior walls and other surfaces. The mosque, the largest such structure built during the first half of the 19th century, is more impressive at a distance than close-up. Though its artistic merit is questionable, the mosque is an unparalleled contribution to the Cairo skyline. Situated on the summit of the Citadel high atop the Citadel grounds, its great dome and towering minarets are the first features that catch your eye at the fortress.

Finally, a three-hour drive will take you to Port Said and your awaiting ship.

- Entrance fees to all sites mentioned in the program.
- Beverage package during meals (including bottled water, tea and coffee).

- The local currency is the Egyptian pound.
- This tour involves extensive walking and long driving times.
- Expected weather: sunny and very hot.
- Dress for the weather, wear comfortable shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen and water.
- For the visit of Mohamed Ali Mosque, shoes must be removed before entering.  
No shorts are allowed for men and women. Women are required to cover their head and shoulders. We recommend bringing your own scarf.
- The order of the visits may be reversed.
