What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our tours are offered with English speaking guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication. Passengers should be fit and active to join tours which include hiking, biking, snorkelling, boating, or similar activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- You can book shore excursions onboard, using our "sign-up lists" available at the library, except tour including Manuel Antonio National Park, which must be booked in advance with Star Clippers and is not available onboard.
- Debark tours ending at the airport and transfers can now be pre-booked prior your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- A minimum number of participants is required for tours; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned on the daily program of each port.
- The Captain reserves the right to alter the itinerary in order to suit wind, weather and local conditions.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100 % cancellation fees will be charged.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes, which will be relayed to passengers during the Cruise Director's onboard information sessions. Last updated tour descriptions are available in a file at the library.

ISLA TORTUGA, COSTA RICA

Wet landing is required in this port!

ISLA TORTUGA - Curu Private Reserve

Duration: 02:00 approx.

Transportation: walking tour

Price: 59 €

Activity level: moderate

Min 15 / Max 56 participants

At the reserve your naturalist tour guide will introduce you to the wide variety of wildlife that thrives here, including up to 200 species of birds, capuchin and howler monkeys as well as sloths and anteaters.

There are 4.5 km of coastline with beautiful white sandy beaches and tiny coves.

Two thirds of this small reserve are preserved as primary forest.

Curu reserve is located in one of the most scenic regions of Costa Rica, known for its calm seas and transparent waters.

At the end of the tour, you will take a tender ride (approx. 30 minutes) to the beach at Isla Tortuga, where you will have time at leisure to enjoy the beach.

Please note: wet landing is required at Curu reserve. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed.

Guests will have to walk for approx. 2 km on sandy, rocky and uneven surfaces. Heat and humidity are factors to consider.

Guests are advised to wear light clothing and walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.

QUEPOS, COSTA RICA

QUEPOS - Manuel Antonio National Park and beach break

Duration: 04:30 approx.

Transportation: air-conditioned motorcoach (or minibus)

Price: 95 €

Activity level: moderate

Min 12 / Max 24 participants

This shore excursion can only be pre-booked and will not be available onboard.

This excursion is one of the very best in the Central Pacific region of Costa Rica and a great opportunity to experience the rain forest up close.

Manuel Antonio National Park is a jewel amongst Costa Rica's National parks whose fragile ecosystem shelters a variety of wildlife including mammals and tropical birds. The park protects 683 hectares of tropical rain forest and over a thousand different species of flora. Another major attraction are the white sand beaches at the edge of the forest.

After twenty minutes' drive, you will arrive at the National Park, where you will enjoy a guided walk through the park (approx. 1.5 hours). Your guide will take you on a trek through the dense rainforest and tell you all about this unique environment, rich in biodiversity. Before heading back to Quépos you will enjoy a tropical fruit buffet prepared by your naturalist guide and some free time at a beach (outside the national park area) to sunbathe or swim.

Please note: Manuel Antonio Park is one of the most visited attractions in Costa Rica so you can expect large numbers of people and queues to get in. Wildlife sightings are not guaranteed.

This tour involves moderate walking (approx. 1.5 hours) on uphill and uneven surfaces.

Guests are advised to wear hiking shoes (or shoes with a good grip) and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, raincoat or poncho and a waterproof protection for camera and mobile.

For the stop at the beach, guests are advised to bring a towel from the ship and wear a swimsuit under the clothes.

Star Clippers is required to submit to the National Park full name, passport number, age and nationality of each visitor.



QUEPOS - Mangrove wildlife and boat cruise

Duration: 03:30 approx.

Transportation: air-conditioned motorcoach (or minibus) and boat

Activity level: easy

Min 15 / Max 25 participants

A ride through the Mangrove is like entering another world. The trees that grow in the brackish water form a unique and very fragile ecosystem.

Most of the trees grow along the estuary, developing an aerial root system. At low tide the exposed tree roots make a perfect habitat for crabs. In the upper part of the forest, you can expect to see monkeys and a great variety of birdlife including herons, egrets, and spoonbills, amongst others.

A private van will be waiting on the pier to take you on a 25-minute drive to the departure point. Here a naturalist tour guide will tell you all about the mangrove, which, although you may not know it, plays a vital role in the sustainability of the planet. A shaded boat will take you deep into the heart of the mangrove and you can try and spot all the different species of wildlife that live there. After a boat ride of 1h45 you will arrive at the village and enjoy a well-deserved snack before taking the van back to the pier (30 minutes). You can also be dropped off at Quepos, where you will find several restaurants and shops.

Please note: Tour sequence may vary (this tour runs with the tides). Guests are advised to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, raincoat (or poncho) and a camera / mobile protection.

QUEPOS - Savegre River Floating Adventure

Duration: 05:00 approx.

Transportation: air-conditioned minibus

Price: 115 €

Activity level: strenuous

Min 12 / Max 24 participants

You will leave Quepos on your airconditioned motorcoach for a one-and-a-half-hour drive through rural towns, palms, teak and Melina plantations.

After a short comfort stop where you can often spot toucans and macaws the coach ride continues to the town of Santo Domingo.

Here groups of experienced bilingual guides will be waiting to take you on the two-hour River Floating Adventure.

The guides will give you a briefing on the natural environment and the river itself, which is considered to be one of the most beautiful in Central America.

The scenery and wildlife along the Rio Savegre are legendary; you will enjoy beautiful landscapes, including some palm oil plantations, and may spot white ibis, cormorants, egrets, crocodiles, and herons.

The Floating adventure alternates action and periods of relaxation and at the end of the activity you will get to enjoy a delicious fruit buffet.

Please note: Minimum age for participating in this excursion is 12 years old (minors must be accompanied by an adult).

Max weight for participating in this excursion is 235 lbs / 106 kg. Rafts can accommodate 4-6 pax.

This is a very active tour and is only recommended for guests in very good physical condition.

Swimming experience is required. A waiver must be signed before the activity starts.

Guests are advised to wear a swimsuit under their clothes and to bring water shoes, insect repellent, towel, water and extra dry clothes. Waterproof protection for cameras and mobiles is highly recommended.

Guests can leave their belongings inside the bus, that will be locked during the activity (lockers are not available).

Driving time is approximately 1:30 hours (each way).



GOLFITO, COSTA RICA**GOLFITO - Golfo Dulce dolphin watch and swim stop**

Duration 03:45 approx.

Transportation: motorboat

Price: 129 €

Activity level: moderate

Min 15 / Max 48 participants

Costa Rica's is home to one of the most biologically diverse marine habitats in the world and its warm seas also attract dolphins. The best place to observe these magnificent mammals is in the waters off the Osa Peninsula. You will board your boat and head out to "the most biologically intense area on earth", according to the National Geographic. Here large groups of dolphins, sea turtles and manta rays swim in the clear blue tropical water, putting on an amazing show.

Other possible sightings may include six different species of turtles, large schools of tuna feeding and the occasional marlin or sailfish. During your cruise around the bay, an experienced naturalist guide will provide informative commentary so you will learn about the biology, behavior, and habitats of the marine life you see.

There will be some amazing photo opportunities and, weather permitting, you will have some free time to swim in the calm waters of one of the local beaches.

Please note: Going ashore at Enchanted Bay during the swim stop is at discretion of each guest and requires a wet landing.

The itinerary and the tour sequence may be changed at Captain's discretion depending on weather conditions and tide.

This excursion is not recommended for guests who suffer from sea sickness, those with mobility problems, neck/back problems, and pregnant women. Marine life sightseeing is not guaranteed.

Guests are advised to bring swimsuit, sunscreen and a towel from the ship. Wet landing is required.

PARIDA ISLAND (GOLFO DE CHIRIQUI), PANAMA

The Gulf of Chiriqui is known for its lush vegetation, white sandy islands and also one of the largest coral reefs in the Pacific. It spans Panama's pacific coast from the border of Cosa Rica to the Azuero peninsula and is a great place for Big game fishing, diving and snorkeling.

Isla Parida is an uninhabited island teeming with wildlife. It is situated off Panama's Pacific coastline and forms part of the Gulf of Chiriqui Marine Park. Isla Parida and the many smaller islands which surround it are all under UNESCO protection.

IGUANA ISLAND, PANAMA

500 years old and still going strong! The oldest coral reef in the Gulf of Panama extends over 37 acres and boasts 12 different types of coral and over 200 species of fish. Although El Nino has taken a toll on some parts of the reef it still provides some very enjoyable snorkeling.

SAN JOSE ISLAND, PANAMA

San José is the archetypal desert island, a natural paradise where Nature holds sway. Only 30 people actually live there, on land that is privately owned, and the rest of the "population" consists of exotic birds a wide variety of reptiles, and wild pigs, free from natural predators.

BALBOA (Isla Flamenco), PANAMA

Panama Canal is a major shipping route that traverses the Isthmus of Panama in Central America, connecting the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans. The site is steeped in history and visitors will be amazed at the natural beauty of the place as well as marveling at what human engineering can achieve. From the days of Balboa to Teddy Roosevelt, the conquering of the Isthmus has fired the imagination of explorers, presidents, and engineers.

The Panama Canal goes from Cristobal (Atlantic side), in the bay of Limon to Balboa (Pacific side) in the Gulf of Panama. It is approximately 80 km long. Three locks lift the ships 26m above sea level to Lake Gatun and lower them down again.

Debark tours ending at the airport and transfers can be pre-booked prior your cruise.

PANAMA - Miraflores locks visit (ending at PTY airport)

Duration: 03:30 approx.

Transportation: air-conditioned motorcoach

Price: 75 €

Activity level: easy

Min 10 participants

This excursion is suitable for passengers disembarking in Panama who have flights leaving after 3:30 pm

Don't miss this opportunity to visit one of the greatest wonders created by man: Panama Canal and its Miraflores Lock.

Miraflores Locks are the first set of locks a ship must pass when transiting through the Panama Canal from the Pacific. When a ship is inside the locks, the water level rises, lifting the ship, allowing it to traverse the canal. On this adventure, observe the locks in action. Your official Panamanian guide will explain the process as you watch a vessel make its way through. Afterwards, visit the new and amazing IMAX Theatre located right next to the locks.

Through the magic of 3D and IMAX cameras, audiences everywhere can take an incredible trip through one of the seven wonders of the modern world in "Panama Canal 3D – A land divided, a world united".

The film sweeps you from the days when Conquistadores struggled through a water-soaked quagmire, to the American engineering achievement that revolutionized shipping and tropical medicine. It shows the visionary present of Panama and their efforts to expand the 100-year-old waterway to accommodate "post-Panamax" ships.

After this unique journey, re-board your bus and drive through Panama City to the Panama-Tocumen Airport, where you will catch your flight back home!

Please note: You will spend approx. 1 hour at the Miraflores locks. The actual sighting of vessels in the lock chambers depends entirely on canal scheduling.

Driving time between the port and Miraflores locks takes approx. 45 minutes. Driving time between the locks and the airport takes approx. 45 minutes.

Guests who have purchased a shared transfer cannot choose their pickup time. There will be one fixed departure from the port at about 09:00am, the arrival at the airport will be around 09:45/10:00am.
