What you need to know before booking your shore excursion:

- All our excursions are led by local English-speaking guides or driver-guides.
- The length of the tours and time spent on the sites is given as an indication as it may vary depending on weather, sea and traffic conditions and on the group's pace.
- The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.
- Transportation: roads in the islands can be winding and bumpy. Vehicles used (coasters, minibuses, minivans) have generally small seats and limited space and legroom.
- Guests will be required to sign a liability waiver to participate in some activities.

How you can book your shore excursions:

- Shore excursions can be booked on board, using the booking forms (sign-up lists) available at the Excursion Desk.
- The price of the excursion will be added to your on-board account.
- Transfers and debark tours ending at the airport can also be pre-paid prior to your cruise.
- In order to provide the best service and to avoid disappointments, please book your shore excursions as early as possible: places are limited and there is a booking deadline for each port.
- Booking deadlines will be indicated on the Daily Program and on the booking forms.
- Cancellation and changes are possible until the booking deadline. After the booking deadline, 100% cancellation fees will be charged.
- A minimum number of participants is required for each tour; if the required number is not attained, the tour may be cancelled.

Important notes:

- Departure times of the tour are mentioned in the Daily Program of each port.
- All information concerning excursions is correct at the time of printing. **However, Star Clippers reserves the right to make changes.** The latest updated tour descriptions are available on board the ship in a file at the Excursion Desk and on Star Clippers' website (you can download the file using the QR code).

ÎLES DES SAINTES (Terre-de-Haut) - - Time at leisure (no shore excursions organized)

Terre-de-Haut, the jewel of the Îles des Saintes archipelago, is an island with a peaceful and authentic atmosphere. Known for the Baie des Saintes, one of the most beautiful in the world, it enchants visitors with its pristine beaches, colorful houses, and relaxed way of life.

The island, marked by its colonial past, is home to the crystal-clear waters, while the village streets reveal a typical Creole charm. Terre-de-Haut is the ideal stop for an intimate and natural exploration of the French Caribbean.

The ship will be at anchor and there will be a tender service to the village (“le Bourg”), but also to the beach at Ilet à Cabrits, a small, inhabited island located on the opposite side of the bay (natural beach, with no services).

Your excursion begins with a short, air-conditioned drive through the town of Portsmouth, passing the scenic Indian River, up to Syndicate National Park. This park is nestled at the foot of Dominica’s tallest mountain, Morne Diablotin, in the Northern Forest Reserve. A local Forest Guide will join you and lead a comprehensive hike on the Nature Trail, approximately 2000 ft (600 m) above sea level.

During the hike, your guide will narrate details about the flora, fauna, and exotic birdlife within this forest reserve. This reserve is unique as it is the last remaining habitat of the endemic birds - the Sisserou and the Jaco Parrot. The Sisserou has been relocated to an off-island bird sanctuary until the vegetation recovers.

After the hike, you will proceed to Milton Falls (also known as Syndicate Falls), a secluded waterfall surrounded by lush forest. Watch the water plunge powerfully into the natural pool below, where you will have the opportunity to take a refreshing swim. Walk back to Syndicate Café for refreshments before returning to your ship in Cabrits.

Please note:

- ✓ The walk is approximately 1.5 hours at a gentle pace on a relatively easy, flat, and well-signposted route.
- ✓ The Milton Falls trail is a short 15-minute walk with minimal elevation gain but includes 4 river crossings - proper hiking shoes are mandatory. Rainforest terrain can be muddy and slippery.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable hiking shoes (closed shoes with grip), and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, and water shoes.
- ✓ If you wish to swim at the waterfall, wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel.
- ✓ Driving time is approximately 45 minutes each way between Cabrits and Syndicate National Park, with a driver-guide. The hiking guide will join at the National Park.

Situated in the center of the town of Portsmouth in northern Dominica, the “Indian River” owes its name to the Kalinago people, formerly known as Carib Indians, who once settled on its upper banks. The river flows from the Morne aux Diaboles mountain range and meanders gently through the lowlands of Portsmouth into the Caribbean Sea. Because it is below sea level, the lower parts of the river are brackish, supporting a unique ecosystem of flora and fauna. Species such as herons, kingfishers, and iguanas are often seen here and many still thrive even after the devastation caused by Hurricane Maria. The surrounding vegetation continues to flourish and regenerate.

Experienced boatmen will row you in traditional wooden boats, moving slowly to let you take in the rich wildlife and lush vegetation along the banks. You will also see filming locations from Pirates of the Caribbean.

Upriver, you will disembark for a short 10-minute stroll through botanical gardens and visit the famous Bush Bar. Try the signature “Dynamite” rum punch - a strong local specialty.

Please note:

✓ Rowboats accommodate up to 8 passengers. The boat ride includes a safety briefing and lasts approximately one hour round-trip.

✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water.

✓ The drive between the port and the Indian River is approximately 15 minutes. A driver-guide will accompany you on the drive; river guides will take over for the rowboat tour.

DOMINICA (Cabrits) - Pointe Baptiste Chocolate Factory

Enjoy a scenic tour of the island in air-conditioned comfort as you head towards your destination: the Pointe Baptiste Estate, located near Calibishie Village. This private domain stretches over 25 acres and features a historic guesthouse from the 1930s, a chocolate factory with a cottage above it, and magnificent gardens filled with flowers.

Cocoa is grown and harvested by local producers who follow ecological and sustainable practices. The chocolate factory is a small family business committed to these principles.

Upon arrival, family members will welcome you personally and invite you to explore their estate. You will learn about cocoa cultivation and the chocolate-making process. They will enthusiastically share their knowledge and explain the journey from cocoa bean to chocolate bar.

Discover the unique flavors of their gourmet chocolates: dark chocolate bars ranging from 60%, 80%, 90%, up to 100% pure cocoa beans, infused with ginger, coffee, spices (nutmeg, cinnamon, cloves), chili, lemongrass, tangerine, mint, and more. Each guest will receive a chocolate bar of their choice and may also purchase truffles or cocoa nibs.

The excursion also includes a tour of the estate’s flower garden, one of the most beautiful in Dominica, featuring a wide variety of mature trees, flowers, orchids, and medicinal plants. The air is fragrant with jasmine, ylang-ylang, and frangipani, creating a paradise for birds, butterflies, and nature lovers. After the tour, there will be time to enjoy refreshments before returning to the ship.

Please note:

✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water.

✓ The journey between Cabrits and Pointe Baptiste takes approx. 50-60 minutes, on winding and occasionally bumpy roads across the mountains.

Get set... to get wet! Welcome to the "Nature Island" and the legendary Land of 365 Rivers—perfect for a wet, wild, and wonderful adventure. A scenic 45-minute drive takes you to the river launch site, where you'll receive a safety briefing and be outfitted with a life vest, paddle, and specially designed inner tube.

Once in the water, let the river carry you gently along as you spin, swirl, and float through lush, exotic scenery. Midway, enjoy a stop for a classic Dominican pastime—river bathing—where you can take a refreshing swim in crystal-clear waters. Then continue your tubing journey down the scenic waterway to the exit point.

Our professional guides are nearby at all times to ensure your safety and comfort. Back on land, relax at the Hillsborough Reception Center and enjoy a taste of local hospitality with fresh fruit and the island's famous rum punch before heading back to your ship.

Please note:

- ✓ Participants must be in excellent physical condition and able to swim and are required to sign a waiver.
- ✓ Min age: 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight: 235 lbs / 106 kg.
- ✓ This tour is weather-dependent, especially after heavy rain. River conditions may lead to cancellation or changes for safety if river conditions are unsafe.
- ✓ Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring a towel, water shoes, sunscreen, insect repellent, water and a change of dry clothes.
- ✓ The journey between Cabrits and the river launch site takes approximately 60 minutes (on winding roads, with a driver-guide). You will spend around 45 minutes tubing down the river.

MARTINIQUE (Les Anses d'Arlet) - Explore the South of Martinique

This authentic tour takes you through the southern part of Martinique, offering some of the island's most beautiful views, rich history, culture, and local craftsmanship. You will start from the small town of Anses d'Arlet, known for its traditional Creole houses with scale-tiled roofs and the iconic Saint-Henri church facing the large pontoon.

The tour continues along the scenic coastal road to a viewpoint overlooking Diamond Rock, a famous natural landmark. After a photo stop, you will head to "Cap 110", a memorial dedicated to slavery, featuring 15 large busts arranged in a triangular shape to symbolize the transatlantic slave trade between the Americas, Europe, and Africa. Next, continue to Le Diamant village, where you can explore the local market, filled with tropical fruits, spices, and other vibrant goods.

A visit to the Trois Rivières Rum Distillery follows, where you will learn about their special white and aged rums crafted since 1976. The tour concludes with a stop at the famous pottery village located on a former Jesuit Monastery near Les Trois Ilets, where you will have approximately 40 minutes to visit workshops of skilled craftsmen and artists, view their creations, and possibly find a unique souvenir to take home.

Please note:

- ✓ Roads are winding, so this is not the ideal tour for guests suffering from motion sickness.
- ✓ The bus drive between each stop is between 10 and 20 minutes, plus 30 min between Trois Ilets and the port.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen and water.



GRENADA (Saint George’s) - Chocolate and falls

This aromatic island tour offers a fascinating look into the world of Grenada’s celebrated organic chocolate. Your journey begins with a visit to the Diamond Chocolate Factory, located in the village of Victoria on the island’s west coast. Housed in a converted 18th-century rum distillery originally built by French monks, the factory is home to the renowned “Jouvay” chocolate - named one of the world’s top ten chocolates by National Geographic. Although the visit does not include entry into the production area of the factory, you will gain insight into the full process of chocolate-making - from the harvesting of cocoa beans to seeing them sun-dried on traditional trays. A walk through the cocoa garden offers the chance to observe cocoa trees alongside other fragrant plants like nutmeg, cloves, chili, tropical flowers, and fruit trees. The visit concludes with a delicious chocolate tasting session. Afterward, continue to Concord Falls, set amidst the lush tropical forest where nutmeg and cocoa trees grow along the hillsides. Upon arrival, relax with a complimentary drink and, if conditions permit, take a refreshing swim in the natural waterfall pool. Following your visit, enjoy the scenic 45-minute drive back to the cruise terminal.

Please note:

- ✓ The order of visits may be reversed, with the waterfall visit first and the chocolate factory second.
- ✓ Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and bring sunscreen, a hat, sunglasses, a towel from the ship and water.
- ✓ Guests will have the opportunity to swim at the waterfall. The water may not always be crystal clear - particularly after rain. The terrain around the waterfall is uneven and can be slippery.
- ✓ This tour involves a long total travel time by minibus: 1h15min from St George’s to the Chocolate factory, 45 min from the Chocolate factory to the waterfall, 45min from the waterfall to St George’s. Roads in Grenada are winding and may be bumpy in places.

GRENADA (Saint George’s) - Trek to Bamboo Falls - A Rainforest Experience

This excursion is perfect for nature enthusiasts, offering a scenic and enriching journey that begins in St. George’s and winds up through steep, twisting roads to the heart of Grenada’s lush interior. The destination: Grand Etang Forest Reserve, a vibrant sanctuary nestled 1,900 feet above sea level in the island’s Central Mountain Range. Surrounded by dense rainforest, towering mahogany trees, tropical ferns, and colorful blooms, Grand Etang is home to a wide variety of birdlife and local wildlife. From here, an invigorating trek begins—leading you through a private plantation rich with nutmeg, cocoa, bananas, and other tropical plants, before reaching the stunning Bamboo Falls. The hike to the falls takes approximately 30 minutes and can be muddy or slippery, particularly after rainfall, so sturdy, closed-toe footwear with good grip is essential. You’ll also cross a shallow river, with water up to knee height, so expect your shoes to get wet. Bamboo Falls is considered one of Grenada’s most beautiful and iconic waterfalls—well worth the effort of the hike. If you’d like to take a dip, wear your swimsuit under comfortable hiking clothes and consider bringing aqua shoes. After the trek return to the Cruise Terminal.

Please note:

- ✓ This is a strenuous tour and is suitable only for guests in very good physical condition. The route includes muddy trails, steep inclines, and a river crossing. Be prepared to get your feet and shoes wet while crossing the stream.
- ✓ Minimum age to participate is 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult).
- ✓ Wear light clothing and comfortable hiking shoes (closed-toe with good grip), and bring a hat, sunscreen and plenty of water. Guests who wish to swim at the waterfall should wear a swimsuit under a cover-up and bring aqua shoes.
- ✓ The drive from the port to the trailhead takes approx. 45 minutes on a winding road that may be bumpy in places.

Sail from St. George's Harbor aboard a comfortable catamaran and cruise along Grenada's scenic west coast to your first stop: Molinere Bay. Here, you'll enjoy a snorkeling experience at the renowned Underwater Sculpture Park, located within Grenada's Marine Protected Area. The statues are thoughtfully placed to complement the reef's natural contours and promote marine life.

Following your underwater exploration, the catamaran continues to Mango Bay Beach for a second stop. This is a wet landing, requiring guests to step into ankle-deep water to reach the shore. After time to relax or swim, enjoy a leisurely one-hour sail back to the cruise terminal.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- ✓ Minimum age to participate is 12 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult).
- ✓ Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers. Guests must be able to walk through shallow water at Mango Bay. Half of the boat has shade.
- ✓ Unlimited beverages are provided throughout, including rum punch (after the snorkeling), juices and mineral water.
- ✓ Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a towel, sunscreen, sunglasses, aqua shoes and a hat. Mask, snorkel, and snorkel vest are provided (no fins).
- ✓ The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather conditions and tides.

After your underwater exploration, continue your voyage towards the picturesque Salt Whistle Bay. This idyllic beach offers the perfect setting to swim in turquoise waters, relax on soft, powdery sands, or simply bask in the serene beauty of the bay. Enjoy a scenic sail back, with the gentle sea breeze and stunning vistas making for the perfect end to your tropical escape.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with reduced mobility, back or neck issues, or pregnant women.
- ✓ Minimum age is 12 years, and children must be accompanied by an adult.
- ✓ Snorkeling is optional, but only suitable for experienced swimmers.
- ✓ Wear your swimsuit under a cover-up and bring a hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and a towel. Snorkeling equipment is not provided - please bring your gear from the ship.
- ✓ Rum punch will be served after snorkeling and swimming.
- ✓ The itinerary and stop sequence may be adjusted at the Captain's discretion based on weather and sea conditions.
- ✓ The excursion may be cancelled if the sea is rough.



SAINT LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Panoramic Caribbean coast and Soufrière

Panoramic | Sightseeing **IMPORTANT:** this tours leaves from Marigot bay and ends in Soufrière bay.

Departing from the picturesque Marigot Bay, you'll travel along the island's western coast, winding past the charming fishing villages of Anse la Raye and Canaries on your way south. Stop at the inviting Villa des Pitons (or similar), a hillside hotel offering a delicious Creole buffet lunch with spectacular views over St. Lucia's lush rainforest. From here, the majestic Pitons - two towering volcanic peaks that symbolize the island - dominate the landscape and inspire awe. Next, visit the historic Soufrière Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths, established in 1745 and one of the island's oldest estates. On a guided walk through the gardens, you'll see vibrant tropical plants and cascading waterfalls tumbling over mineral-streaked rocks and surrounded by thick jungle ferns.

The water flows through underground channels to a series of mineral baths at varying temperatures, prized for their therapeutic qualities. Continuing your journey through the verdant rainforest, you'll reach La Soufrière, the world's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly to the crater's edge, where a stark moonscape of barren earth and gravel surrounds bubbling mud pools releasing steam and the unmistakable scent of sulphur. You'll have the chance to take a warm dip in the sulphur pool beneath the bridge - an unforgettable experience.

Please note:

- ✓ Wear a swimsuit under your clothes and comfortable walking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, water and insect repellent. Water shoes and swimming goggles are also recommended if you wish to swim at the sulfur pool (sulfur water may damage jewelry and swimsuits and can irritate the eyes). Wet clothing is not permitted on buses.
- ✓ Lunch*: A buffet lunch is included, but beverages are not. Bring some US dollars to purchase drinks.
- ✓ The drive from Marigot to Soufrière takes approximately 1 hour 45 minutes, on winding roads.

SAINT LUCIA (Marigot bay) - Offroad adventure in St Lucia

Experience fun, history, and stunning scenery on this offroad adventure that offers a unique way to see the island! Hop into your 4x4 vehicle and begin your journey through lush valleys where banana plants sway in the breeze. Enjoy a bit of off-roading as you drive through local communities, with stops along the way to sample refreshing coconut water and other seasonal fruits.

Your forest adventure starts with a short hike along a river to a charming local waterfall, where water cascades over rocks surrounded by vibrant greenery. Take a refreshing dip in the river before returning to the jeep for a drive to the quaint fishing village of Anse la Raye. Stroll along the waterfront, interact with friendly villagers, and if lucky, watch fishermen bring in their daily catch. Visit the historic Roman Catholic village church, one of the island's oldest.

On your way back, drive along a scenic coastal road with elevated views of the sea - perfect for photo stops. The final stop is at the Marigot Bay viewpoint, where you will take in the beautiful view of this picturesque bay and you can purchase some of the island's sauces before heading back to your ship.

Please note:

- ✓ This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility, pregnant women, or those with back, neck, or other conditions sensitive to bumpy roads.
- ✓ Minimum age to participate is 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult).
- ✓ Vehicles are open 4x4 vehicles accommodating 10 to 14 passengers. Remain seated while the vehicle is moving.
- ✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes, and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent and water.
- ✓ If you wish to swim at the waterfall, wear a swimsuit under your clothes, bring a towel from the ship, and water shoes. The waterfall water may not always be crystal clear, especially after rain, as the river carries topsoil and silt.
- ✓ The hike to the waterfall is approximately 15 minutes each way, over uneven trails with rough, sometimes slippery rocks. Be prepared to get your feet and shoes wet while crossing the stream.



SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Natural attractions of La Soufrière

Drive through the historic town of Soufrière, passing the town square and Cathedral, and arrive at Sulphur Springs Park - home to the Caribbean's only drive-in volcano. The road leads directly into the remnants of a volcanic crater, a dramatic moonscape of barren earth and gravel where pools of muddy water bubble and clouds of steam rise with the distinctive scent of sulphur.

Continue your journey to the Soufrière Estate's Diamond Botanical Gardens, Waterfall & Mineral Baths. Established in 1745, this is one of the island's oldest estates. Stroll through the lush botanical garden, admire tropical plants lining the path, and enjoy the beauty of the cascading waterfall before reboarding the bus.

After a short drive, arrive at a charming hillside restaurant offering panoramic views of the iconic Pitons - St. Lucia's famous twin peaks rising dramatically from Soufrière Bay.

Have your camera ready for a perfect photo opportunity while enjoying a complimentary glass of local rum punch or fruit juice on the verandah. The tour concludes with a short drive back down to the port.

Please note:

✓ Dress for the weather, wear comfortable walking shoes and to bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, and US \$ if they wish to purchase souvenirs.

SAINT LUCIA (Soufrière bay) - Zip line ride at Morne Coubaril Estate

This excursion combines a short sightseeing experience with the adrenaline rush of zip lining beneath the towering Petit Piton, offering breathtaking views of the historic town of Soufrière and the Caribbean Sea.

Depart from the port and enjoy a brief drive through the rustic town of Soufrière to Morne Coubaril Estate, a working plantation nestled in lush tropical surroundings. Begin with a guided walking tour of the estate's manicured gardens and traditional facilities. Visit the manioc house to learn how cassava bread is made, see how coconuts are de-husked and copra is dried, and enjoy fresh coconut water and jelly. At the cocoa and coffee house, taste a ripe cocoa bean and discover the fermentation, drying, and polishing process—complete with a demonstration of the traditional cocoa dance. Watch the mule-driven sugar cane mill in action and sip some freshly pressed cane juice.

After your tour, get equipped with a harness, helmet, and gloves, and receive a safety briefing before beginning your zip line adventure. Eight cables carry you effortlessly through the rainforest canopy and across a bamboo-shaded gorge. You'll zip past banyan, coconut, plum, and mango trees while enjoying stunning views of the bay and the Pitons. Your adventure concludes with a refreshment stop at a nearby restaurant and the opportunity to browse the estate's gift shop before returning to the ship.

Please note:

✓ This tour is only suitable for guests in very good physical condition. It is not recommended for guests with a fear of heights, pregnant women, or those with heart or respiratory conditions. Participants must sign a waiver.

✓ Minimum age to participate is 8 years (minors must be accompanied by an adult). Max weight: 250 lbs / 113 kg.

✓ Wear comfortable clothing (jeans or bermuda-length shorts recommended), sneakers or closed-toe sandals (no flip-flops), shirts with short sleeves (no sleeveless tops) and bring hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, water, a change of shirt and US\$ or credit card for gift shop purchases. Long hair should be tied back in a ponytail or bun

- ✓ This tour is considered strenuous and is suitable only for guests in very good physical condition.

- ✓ The nature trail involves hiking through rainforest on uneven terrain, dirt tracks, narrow paths, and moderate to steep inclines. The trail may be muddy if it has rained recently. The hike takes approximately 45 minutes, depending on the group’s pace. There is limited shade along the trail.
- ✓ Wear light, comfortable clothing and appropriate hiking shoes and bring a hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, and water. A refreshment will be served after the hike.
- ✓ The drive between Soufrière and the trailhead takes approximately 15 minutes on a winding, bumpy road.

Please note:

- ✓ Airlines require guests on international flights to arrive at the airport at least 2:30 prior to flight departure.
- ✓ Transfers from the beach to the airport will be arranged at below three fixed times:
 - at 12:45 pm: for flights after 15:30 / 3:30pm (arrival at the airport at 13:15 / 1:15 pm).
 - at 14:15 / 2:15 pm for flights after 17:00 / 5:00pm (arrival at the airport at 14:45 / 2:45 pm).
 - at 16:30 / 4:30 pm for flights after 19:00 / 7:30 pm (arrival at the airport at 17:00 / 5:00 pm).
- ✓ Services included: transfers (port -> beach -> airport); luggage storage with assistance from a luggage attendant; one welcome drink; one beach chair per person and one shared umbrella; access to shower facilities and washrooms; two towels per guest (one for the beach, one for post-shower use).

BGI airport is located 18 km from the Cruise Terminal (approx. 45 minutes drive).

All guests are requested to leave the ship by 10:00am. There is no left-luggage service at the cruise terminal.



EXCURSIONS ACTIVITY LEVEL:

- ✓ **Easy:** excursion accessible to all participants, as it mainly takes place by bus or boat. Any footpaths and stairs that need to be negotiated are short or easy.
- ✓ **Moderate:** a certain basic level of fitness is required; excursion involving moderate walking - sometimes over uneven or unpaved paths and stairs.
- ✓ **Moderate to strenuous:** active participation is required; excursion involving walking long distances over uneven or steep terrain. May involve several flights of stairs or extended staircases.
- ✓ **Strenuous:** a good level of fitness is required; an excursion involving extensive uphill walking on inclines, uneven terrain with many steps. Excursion involving off-road driving, not suitable for pregnant women or anyone with a medical condition (back, neck, etc.) that could be affected by bumpy roads.
- ✓ **Active (sport):** Very good physical condition, stamina and skill are required. Passengers should be fit and active to participate in tours involving hiking, kayaking, snorkeling, cycling or similar activities.

The level of physical fitness required for our activities is given as a very general indication.

MAIN EXCURSIONS CATEGORIES (CARIBBEAN & CENTRAL AMERICA)

- ✓ **Sightseeing:** it gives a quick but enriching overview, visiting and seeing the main attractions, landmarks and places of interest in a particular area, often including popular spots and sometimes hidden gems.
- ✓ **Panoramic:** it involves a limited number of long drives with commentary by the guide, no internal visits and - generally - limited walking between stops.
- ✓ **Active & Adventure:** Hiking, kayaking, Zip line, 4x4 off-road.

- ✓ For ports with tender service (ship at anchor), bring a backpack or fanny pack so that your hands are free to hold on to the safety grip when boarding the tender.
